*L*as Vegas is one of the fastest growing metro areas in the nation! Once considered a famed resort, solely for entertainment and gaming,

Las Vegas has rapidly developed into a positive community adapting to all the needs of family life.

It's home to two of the nation's top master planned communities: Summerlyn and Green Valley.

An expanding skilled labor force, an exceptional tax structure, a pro-business environment and a great climate all contribute to making Las Vegas the "total package."

Each month, visitors and new residents flock to Las Vegas to enjoy its warm climate, fabulous resorts, unparalleled entertainment, southwestern lifestyle and economic prosperity.

The population explosion has resulted in great opportunities for new businesses and more jobs. *Inc.* rated Las Vegas as the #1 entrepreneurial city in America, citing the thousands of new businesses that start in Nevada each year. *Fortune* named Las Vegas as the #2 city in the country in which to do business.

Because tourism adds up to nearly one-third of the state's annual tax revenue, business owners are not subject to corporate income tax or franchise, inventory or unitary taxes. Residents pay no personal income tax. The minimal tax burden means Nevadans can keep more of the money they earn. The U.S. Commerce Department's Economic Analysis Bureau ranks Las Vegas as the top metro area for income per capita, with an annual growth rate of 2.3%.

POPULATION:

Currently, Clark County is home to 2.3 million people and growing!

LOCATION:

Las Vegas is the County Seat of Clark County, NV and is 2,174 feet above sea level. Las Vegas is 290 miles northeast of Los Angeles, 378 miles northwest of Phoenix, and 447 miles south of Reno.

DRIVER'S LICENSE

New residents have 30 days to obtain a Nevada driver's license. To get a license, you must pay a fee (fees vary); all applicants must take a vision test. Other tests will be waived if you are 25 years old or older and have no special restrictions; your out-of-state license is valid and you are applying for the same class of license; and/or you have no more than two moving violations and no suspensions, revocations, cancellations or denials in the past four years. If you do not meet these requirements, you will have to take a written test and possibly a skills test.

All license applications are checked through the national Problem Driver Pointer System. Nevada does not automatically transfer all motorcycle endorsements. Commercial driver's licenses can be transferred at Full Service Offices if the driver meets the above requirements and has a current DOT (Department Transportation) physical form.

INSURANCE REQUIREMENTS

In Nevada, vehicle owners are required to carry liability insurance. The minimum requirements are \$15,000 bodily injury, \$30,000 per person per accident and \$10,000 property damage. Proof of insurance must be kept in the vehicle at all times.

DEPARTMENT OF MOTOR VEHICLES

Nevada DMV offices provide booklets of Nevada driving laws, rules and regulations. Voter registration is also offered at the time you apply for or renew your driver's license.

VEHICLE REGISTRATION 5 TAGS

New residents have 30 days to obtain their vehicle registration. The following is a list of the items needed for out-of-state transfers:

- Your state-issued driver's license
- Proof of your Social Security #
- Nevada Proof of Liability Insurance card from a Nevada-licensed agent
- Smog check certificate if needed

- Your current registration(s)
- Title(s), unless held by lien holder
- VIN(s) - vehicle identification numbers are checked at DMV offices
- Your out-of-state license plates
- Cash, check, or money order for fees

Licenses are required for all dogs and cats in Clark County.

- Residents are limited to three adult dogs & three adult cats per household. Special pet fancier's licenses are available that allow up to six cats and dogs.
- All dogs must be restrained by a leash. Cats in the city must also be restrained by a leash.
- All dogs and cats must have license and rabies tags. Rabies shots are required every two years.

COMPARING DIFFERENT AREAS OF THE LAS VEGAS VALLEY



Southern Nevada's 3 largest cities, Las Vegas, Henderson and North Las Vegas, are located in Clark County. While within close proximity to one another, each city is fully independent. The most recent U.S. Census figures put Clark County's population at more than 2 million residents.

LAS VEGAS

While Las Vegas has always been revered for its exciting nightlife, upscale dining, retail and entertainment offerings have taken the city to a new level. Las Vegas is also coming into its own with the expansion of nongaming industries, bringing high-tech companies, notable educational and medical research facilities and cultural arts offerings to the table.

HENDERSON

Henderson has many well-established master-planned communities. It's also home to St. Rose Hospital & Medical Center, Siena Campus. There are 23 elementary schools, six middle schools, six high schools, one charter school and 12 private schools in the Henderson area. Not far away are the

Lake Mead National Recreation Area, historic Boulder City and the Hoover Dam.

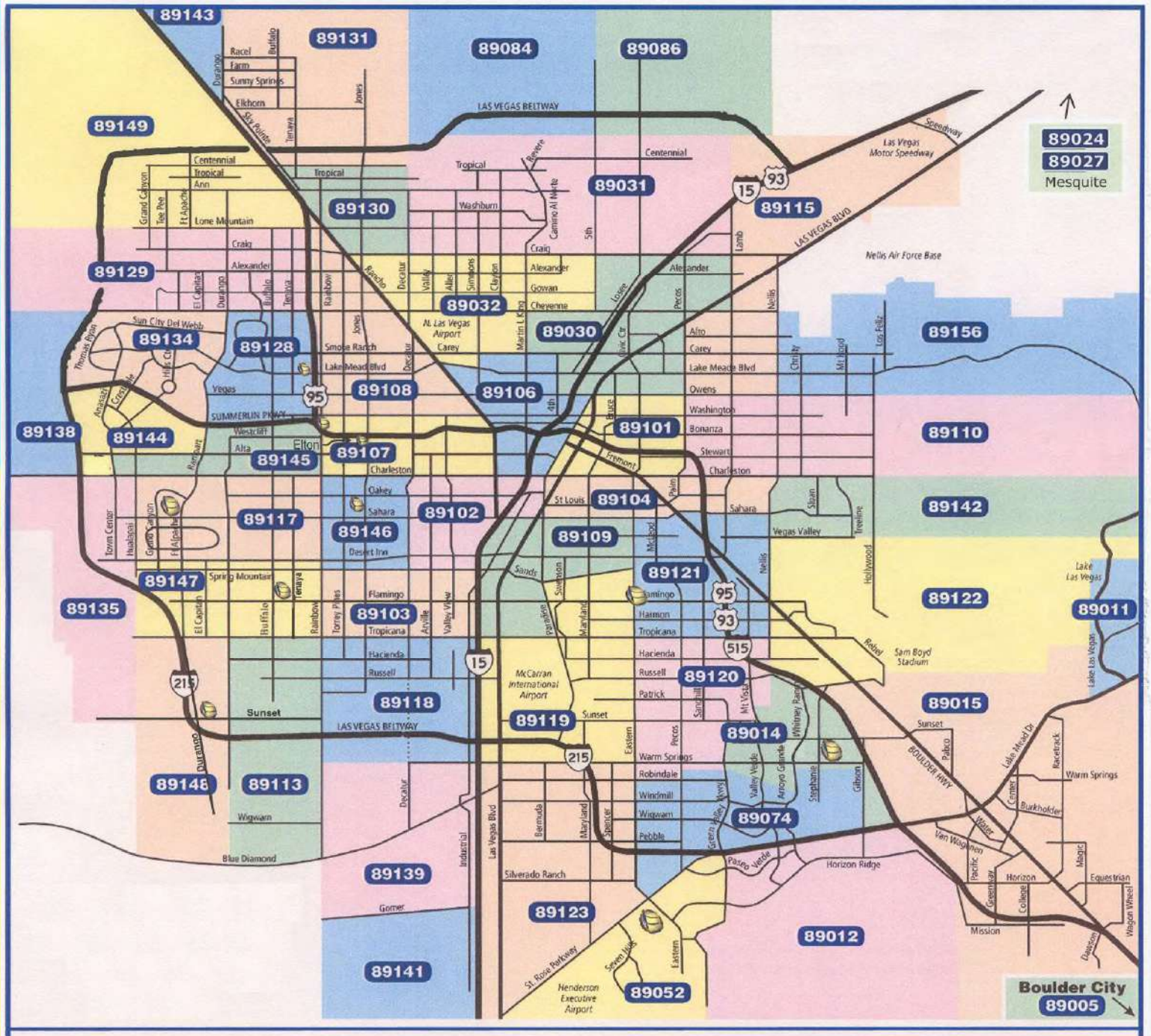
NORTH LAS VEGAS

Some confuse North Las Vegas as being the "northern part" of Las Vegas, but this area is an independent city unto itself. In fact, it was recently named the 3rd fastest-growing mid-sized city in America and has a population of more than 179,000. Several successful master-planned communities have fueled economic development by attracting new business and retail amenities to the area. A proactive city government has led the way in creating a technology hub in the area. The city is home to the bulk of Southern Nevada's manufacturing, technology, distribution and industrial facilities.

Neighborhoods & Communities by Area

Split into four quadrants, each section of Las Vegas holds unique locations and opportunities. From golf courses to neighborhoods and high-rises, the Las Vegas Valley offers so much more than just the casino stereotype!

SOUTHEAST LAS VEGAS

The city of Henderson is in the southeastern part of the Valley. This sprawling area is home to both established neighborhoods and some of the area's most popular master-planned and retirement communities. In recent years, this area has undergone dramatic transformation and brought several amenities to the area: St. Rose Dominican Hospital's Siena campus, the District at Green Valley Ranch and the Henderson Parks and Recreation Department's Multigenerational Center and Outdoor Amphitheater, to name a few.

Southeast Las Vegas is home to several new elementary, middle and high schools and has easy access to other areas of the Valley via proximity to Interstate 215 and U.S. Highway 95. Significant redevelopment is taking place in the downtown area of Henderson with construction of new city government facilities. The area is also close to the Lake Mead National Recreation Area and the historic Boulder City and Hoover Dam.

Listed below are some of the Southeast Valley's major community developments:

Anthem

Anthem is a master-planned community located in the south end of the city of Henderson, at the foothills of the beautiful Black Mountain Range. The area boasts amazing views of both Henderson and the Las Vegas strip. With over 4,700 acres, 3 distinct neighborhoods within the development, a championship golf course and world-class amenities, Anthem is in a league of its own. With housing priced from the mid \$200,000 for homes in Sun City Anthem's age-restricted neighborhood to the Anthem Country Club, which has homes ranging from \$500,000 to over \$2,000,000, there's a home for every taste and need.

Green Valley Ranch

Green Valley Ranch is a 1,310-acre master-planned community in Henderson. Situated at the base of the Black Mountains, this area offers outstanding views of Las Vegas and the Strip and is comprised of a carefully planned mix of land with 775 acres of residential neighborhoods and 310 acres for retail, office, medical facilities. 200+ acres are reserved for amenities like parks, schools, recreational centers, open-space areas, pedestrian/bike paths and houses of worship. The European-inspired Green Valley Ranch Resort, Spa & Casino, adjacent to The District's upscale shopping and dining offerings, draws many locals & out-of-town visitors alike.

Seven Hills

Seven Hills is located in the foothills of the Black Mountains in the south part of the Valley. Seven Hills spans just over 1,200 acres with 3,000 homes that are divided into 25 distinctive neighborhoods. There are 300 luxury homes located in the Estates neighborhood.

Lake Las Vegas

Lake Las Vegas is the crown jewel of master-planned communities in the Las Vegas area. Located in Henderson in the far eastern part of the Valley end route to Lake Mead, in a private canyon with a 322-acre manmade lake, LLV represents the epitome of elegance in the Valley. This is a unique development in which no expense has been spared to create a true Mediterranean feel in the middle of the desert. Prices in this opulent development range from \$400,000 for a condo to over \$10 million for a custom lakeside home.



Tuscany

Tuscany is one of Henderson's newest master-planned communities. Located near Lake Las Vegas, Tuscany is tucked away near the hills that lead to Lake Mead. Residents and guests are greeted at the community's guard-gated entrance by a dramatic stone entrance with cobblestone roads, huge Italian urns and lush landscaping.

MacDonald Highlands

MacDonald Highlands Close to the Strip, MacDonald Highlands is located on 1,200 hilly acres near the McCullough Mountains and will be comprised of 17 distinct neighborhoods when complete. Residents can choose a semi-custom home from Toll Brothers or Signature Homes, two of the most distinctive builders in the area or build a fully custom home. Behind the guarded gates, residents will find a private golf course, country club, tennis & athletic center & the Jack Nicklaus Academy of Golf.

Sun City MacDonald Ranch

Peacefully nestled among the foothills of Black Mountain, Sun City MacDonald Ranch encompasses nearly 600 acres within MacDonald Ranch. This well-designed 55+ community is smaller than other area Sun City communities, offering 2,500 single family and duplex homes located a short 15-minute drive from the Strip. Amenities include an executive golf course, recreation center, tennis courts, bocce ball, jogging, swimming and spas.

SOUTHWEST LAS VEGAS

In the last few decades, Southwest Las Vegas has gone from desert to a verdant and thriving location for residents looking for a comfortable way of life. You'll find several major master-planned communities with amenities that include good schools, nearby shopping, green spaces, a hospital, recreational facilities and retail and dining offerings. New residents will find a variety of options!

Listed below are some of the Southwest Valley's major community developments:

Spring Valley

Spring Valley is located in the heart of southwestern Las Vegas. Nearly 120,000 people live here and find great shopping, schools, neighborhoods, houses of worship, tennis, golf and other recreational activities. A newcomer may choose from a small condo or a large multi-million-dollar home (and everything in between). The very popular Spanish Trails development is located here.

This established community and its neighborhoods are mature and many of the houses are updated but retain the architecture and feel of decades' past. Those who feel many of the new homes today are "cookie-cutter" will enjoy properties in Spring Valley.

Rhodes Ranch

This master-planned, guard-gated golf community is located in the southwest region of the Valley, right off of Interstate 215 and includes 8 distinctive subdivisions. From luxury golf course homes to condos, Rhodes Ranch has an array of options to fit every need.

Southern Highlands

Southern Highlands is a master-planned community divided into 2 districts, The Estates and The Villages. The Estates is a gated community with custom-built homes settled upon magnificent half-acre to 2-acre lots nestled along the expansive Southern Highlands Private Golf Club. The Villages of Southern Highland have tree-lined streets, which lead to dozens of great family neighborhoods with condos and homes priced from the mid \$250,000s to over \$1 million.

Mountain's Edge

This is one of the newest master-planned communities in the Valley. Developed by one of the area's most respected developers, Mountain's Edge blends the character of the desert and the Old West with the luxuries of modern living. Signature features are Exploration Peak, located at the entryway, and Exploration Park, the western theme park located at the base of the peak. Bicycle trails and walking paths lead up to several vantage points that offering incredible views.

NORTHEAST LAS VEGAS

This area provides a large mix of different types of housing. From affordable mobile homes and houses to high-end mansions on the mountainside, homebuyers have a very wide array of choices. Some of the best views of the Strip are here.

Listed below are some of the Northeast Valley's major community developments:



Aliante

Sun City Aliante

Aliante is the one of the newest master-planned communities in North Las Vegas and is built on 1,905 acres organized into 17 neighborhoods. Builders in the community include KB Homes, Pulte, D.R. Horton and Pardee. Residents have access to amenities such as an amphitheater, 18-hole municipal golf course, 3 beautiful parks, ball fields, basketball and tennis courts, picnic areas and a trail system. Locals also enjoy dining and gaming at Aliante Station Casino & Hotel.

Eldorado

With beautiful mountain views and a wide variety of homes, Eldorado is a moderately priced, well-established community that is rapidly growing and comfortable to live in. Located in North Las Vegas and just 25 miles from the Las Vegas Strip and McCarran International Airport, Eldorado features include lush landscaping, pristine yards, recreation for the whole family and wonderful schools and parks within the development. Homes are priced from the mid \$200,000s through the mid \$500,000s.

Iron Mountain Ranch

Iron Mountain Ranch is a master-planned community that offers smaller neighborhoods within its boundary. Parks and the backdrop of the Mt. Charleston area are just two of the added features to this fantastic community. Neighborhoods within Iron Mountain Ranch include The Mesa, The Prairie, Frontier and Sierra. Both single and two-story designs are available. Residents are within proximity to the Red Rock National Conservation Area, Silverstone Golf Club and Aliante Golf Club.

NORTHWEST LAS VEGAS

Most locals refer to the entire northwestern portion of Las Vegas as "Summerlin," the award-winning Howard Hughes Corporation master-planned community that established this region. However, this area has grown to include an abundance of residential amenities, including upscale dining, shopping and recreational opportunities. Summerlin is still a mainstay of the region, but housing options now range from condominiums and age-restricted communities to elite guard-gated custom homes.

The Valley's largest assemblage of golf courses can be found in the Northwest. Courses include the Badlands, Painted Desert, Los Prados, Angel Park and the only 2 TPC courses in Nevada. Shopping options include the Meadows Mall, Boca Park and the Sahara Pavilion Oasis, as well as a number of trendy outdoor malls. Several neighborhood casinos, such as Santa Fe Station, Suncoast, Fiesta Rancho, Texas Station and Red Rock Resort, offer fine dining, entertainment and gaming.

Listed below are some of the Northwest Valley's major community developments:

Summerlin

Encompassing 36 square miles, the award-winning master-planned community of Summerlin rims the entire western edge of the Las Vegas Valley, framed by Red Rock Canyon National Conservation Area. This enclave offers residents a variety of housing options and amenities, including 8 golf courses, shopping centers, nearly 150 parks, 150+ miles of trails and more public and private schools than any other Las Vegas community. Developed by The Howard Hughes Corporation and named after his grandmother, Summerlin set the standard for community development in Southern Nevada. Major community landmarks include Summerlin Library and Performing Arts Center and the Donald W. Reynolds Cultural Center, the Nevada Ballet Theatre's home.

Queensridge

Housing options in this community include townhomes, single-family homes and custom home estates. Here you'll find European-style architecture, greenbelts, neighborhood parks and beautifully landscaped drives and common areas. Community amenities include the 18-hole championship Badlands Golf Course and the Queensridge Clubhouse, which features fitness facilities, sports courts and swimming pools.

Centennial Hills

Just a 10-minute drive north of Summerlin on the Interstate 215, Centennial Hills is one of the fastest growing areas in the Las Vegas Valley. With the Beltway circling the area and Interstate 95 running through it, Centennial Hills is only 20 minutes to the north end of the Strip and another 5-10 minutes to McCarran International Airport. In addition to the conveniences of the Strip, residents enjoy Centennial Hills because of the proximity to the great outdoors. At the Northwest edge of the desert, many residents go four-wheeling and off-roading. This area is also just half an hour from the ski slopes at Mt. Charleston.

Providence

Providence is a new community located just north of Centennial Hills. With over 7,000 homes and 30 distinct neighborhoods to choose from, options range from condos to luxury estate homes. Residents enjoy close proximity to Mt. Charleston & Floyd Lamb State Park.

The Lakes

Developed in the mid-80s, this unique master-planned community offers mature and lush landscaping. The Lakes neighborhood has over 4,000 homes, from townhomes to luxury estates. The fabulous location makes shopping, dining and the Strip just a short drive away.

TPC at Summerlin

The Tournament Players Club (TPC) at Summerlin is a guard-gated golf course community. Luxury housing options include condos and townhomes, single family and luxury custom estate homes. Several communities within the TPC feature oversized lots and golf course frontage. Average homes are in the multi-million-dollar price range.

SunCity Summerlin

Covering more than 2,400 acres in the northwest part of the Valley, Sun City Summerlin is one of the more well-established active adult communities in Las Vegas. The development is comprised of 7,779 homes, available in a wide variety of sizes and styles, with floor plans ranging from less than 1,100 square feet to more than 3,000 square feet.

Desert Shores

Desert Shores is a master-planned, recreation-oriented community that encompasses 682 acres and includes 22 different residential districts, with everything from condominiums to median priced housing and large custom homes behind private gates. It features 4 manmade lakes, a lagoon-style swimming pool surrounded by a sand beach and palm trees, plus a picnic park with volleyball, basketball and playground facilities. The community docks provide paddle-boating and fishing for the residents.



Silverstone Ranch Las Vegas is at the base of the Sheep Mountain range in the far north area of the Las Vegas Valley. Silverstone Ranch is a master-planned community situated around its centerpiece, the Silverstone Golf Course. New residents have a range of choices, from townhomes to elegant estates. Recreational options include a 6-acre family park, tennis courts, golfing, walking trails and picnic areas.

The Canyons at Summerlin

This upscale golf course village provides housing that ranges from multi-family luxury apartments and single-family homes to executive estates and custom mansions. Designed around the championship Tournament Players Club (TPC), residents enjoy spectacular views of the golf course and the adjacent Red Rock Conservation Area. Neighborhoods located within The Canyons include Canyon Crest, Canyon Gate and Canyon Fairways.

ADJACENT COMMUNITIES

Laughlin, Moapa Valley, Mount Charleston, and Pahrump offer warm and inviting communities, even though they're outside Las Vegas proper. They may be the right choice for you and your family when you relocate to Las Vegas.

Listed below are communities adjacent to Las Vegas:

Pahrump

Pahrump is a census-designated place in Nye County, Nevada and is the largest settlement in the county. The town's motto is "Heart of the New Old West." "Pah" means water and "Rimpi" means stone or rock and became Pahrump, which is the Paiute description for springs or flowing waters. It's located 50 miles west of the south end of Las Vegas and 60 miles east of Death Valley and one of the fastest-growing communities in Nevada.

Laughlin

Laughlin, population 8,000, is a port town on the Colorado River, some 94 miles south of Las Vegas. Situated at the three-corner region joining Nevada, California and Arizona and a resort destination, Laughlin has many attractions, including 10 resorts, casinos, hotels and golf courses. You'll find single-family homes, condos, townhomes, apartments and mobile homes in the area.

Moapa Valley

Moapa Valley is a community located on the edge of Lake Mead National Park and the Valley of Fire State Park. It is 60 miles from

Las Vegas and home to the Clark County Fair and Rodeo in Logandale. Moapa Valley is also home to the Moapa River Indian Reservation. Mt. Charleston is part of the Spring Mountain



Mount Charleston

Range and Toiyabe National Forest and reaches 12,000 feet in elevation. It's Nevada's 8th-highest mountain peak and one of the top 10 most topographically prominent peaks in the US. Featuring trees like Juniper, Mountain Mahogany, Aspen and Ponderosa pine and animals such as wild burros, songbirds, deer and desert tortoises, Mt. Charleston feels like it's a million miles away from the city but is only 35 miles northwest of Las Vegas.



Education

As Las Vegas continues to grow and diversify, educational opportunities are expanding as well. From high-tech public magnet schools to advanced medical skills training facilities, Southern Nevada is quickly gaining a reputation for its wide array of educational offerings. Education, from early childhood and K-12, through graduate school, is a vital part of the community's future. The continued growth of institutions of higher education in Southern Nevada, both in numbers and academic quality and reputation, are helping further the development of a strong, educated workforce, supporting existing local business and enhancing prospects for new job opportunities. Through collaborative efforts, many of those schools are also creating an environment for continued future advancement.

public schools



The Clark County School District is located in Las Vegas and includes 382 schools that serve 312,761 students in grades PK through 12th. As of 2005, CCSD is the 5th largest school district in the US. It serves all of Clark County, including the cities of Las Vegas, Henderson, North Las Vegas, Boulder City, and Mesquite; plus, the census-designated places of Laughlin, Blue Diamond, Logandale, Bunkerville, Goodsprings, Indian Springs, Mount Charleston, Moapa, Searchlight, and Sandy Valley. The district is divided into 7 regions and also operates 25 alternative schools and programs.

The district has earned accolades for its technological aptitude, comprehensive visual arts programs, advanced self-esteem programs and class-size-reduction program. Furthermore, of the 44 National Merit Scholarship semifinalists in Clark County, 41 of them attend CCSD schools. Each CCSD high school offers honors programs, advanced placement courses and international baccalaureate classes that provide opportunities for students to receive both high school and college credit through a testing program at the end of the scholastic year. Magnet programs are geared to students from grades 1 through 12 with special interests, skills and abilities. Unique teaching techniques and strategies are employed to help students focus on their chosen course of study. More than 500 Southern Nevada businesses are part of the CCSD Community Partnership, a program that focuses on increasing student knowledge and skill levels, making classroom learning more relevant to on-the-job workplace experience, and increasing each student's ability to understand what businesses need

In 1997, the state legislature passed laws allowing the formation of charter schools in the State of Nevada. Although sponsored by the local school district, charter schools maintain their own board of directors and operate independent of the district's policies and regulations.

Charter schools are required to abide by state and county laws, but are given a great deal of latitude in the day-to-day operation of the school. The purpose of such alternative education is to improve education via a setting where innovation, experimentation and research can identify effective methods of instruction and then share those findings with more traditional classroom programs.

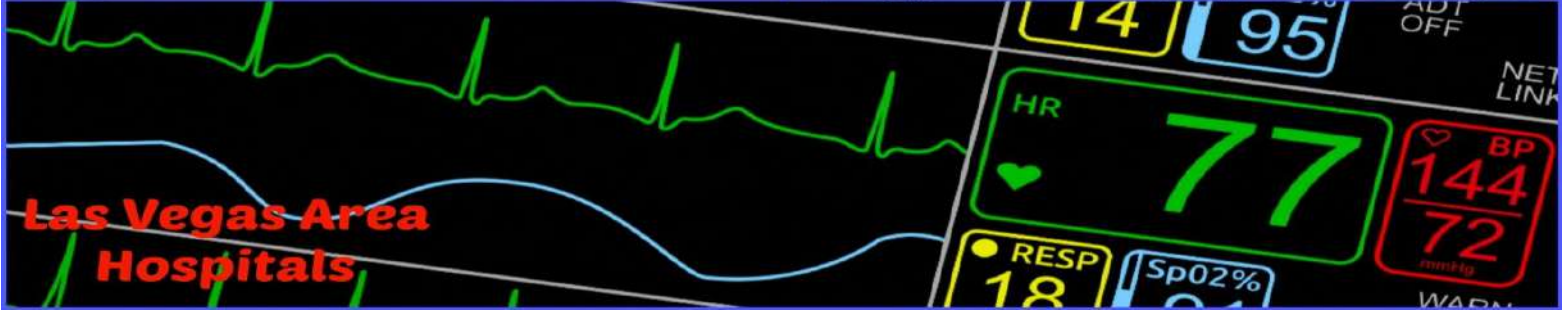

Staying Healthy in a Desert Climate



Staying Hydrated

Dehydration in a desert climate can be a serious concern. In humid climates, perspiration stays on the skin. But in the desert, perspiration evaporates from skin almost immediately, leaving a person with no indication of how much salt and water have been lost. You may not even feel thirsty, but you can't always rely on thirst as an indicator of fluid loss.

When outdoors, consume at least three to four quarts of fluid per day, preferably water. When engaging in physical activity, this fluid requirement increases to four to six quarts. Also, be aware that sodas, coffee, tea and alcohol can contribute to dehydration, so drink these beverages in moderation. If you become lightheaded, stop all activity and move to a cool or shaded area immediately. Should dehydration set in, soaking in a tub of tepid water and drinking plenty of fluids will replace electrolytes.

Skin Protection

There's nothing more beautiful than a bright sun shining high in a clear blue sky! When you're living in Las Vegas, it may be easy to forget that you're also living in the desert, and the dangers of skin cancer are real. While some sun is actually good for you, providing much-needed vitamin D, being in the sun for prolonged periods of time increases the risk of skin damage. Here are some tips from the Nevada Cancer Institute for staying safe in the sun:

Avoid the Sun

Minimize your sun exposure between the hours of 10am and 4pm, when the sun is highest in the sky - seek shade whenever possible. Being at 1,600 to 2,700-foot elevation increases the risk for skin cancer up to 13.5% from sea level.

Cover Yourself

Wear a wide-brimmed hat that protects your head, face, ears and neck. If you are wearing a baseball cap, apply sun block to your ears and neck. When you are outside, always wear sunglasses with 99 to 100% UV absorption. Wear sun-protective clothing like long-sleeved shirts and pants.

Wear Sun Block

Be sure to seek shade and cover your skin first. You'll also want to wear a broad-spectrum sun block instead of sunscreen, with an SPF of at least 30. One bottle of sun block should not last all summer, and there is no such thing as all-day protection! You will need to reapply sun block every 90 minutes and especially after swimming, towel dryings or perspiring, even if the label says the product is waterproof.

Know the Risks

Nevada is ranked 7th in the nation for incidence of melanoma and 11th for skin cancer deaths. Having dark skin does not protect you from developing skin cancer, and it is also extremely important to avoid tanning beds, which give an unprotected direct dose of UV radiation.

Get screened

Screening can help detect the early warning signs of skin cancer and may save your life. Know your body and check for skin changes every month. See your doctor once per year and watch for any changes in moles or lesions.



Gaming, tourism and education remain the leading employment sectors for Southern Nevadans. CONSTRUCTION

More than 86,000 Southern Nevadans are employed in construction trades. Top talent, including electricians, engineers, project managers and superintendents are required for the myriad construction projects under way throughout the valley. Also, the city of Las Vegas supports a Green Building program to support and expand sustainable development. Over time, this support will translate into good paying jobs for the community and attract companies to the area.

EDUCATION

As the largest employer in the area, the Clark County School District (CCSD) has more than 38,000 employees and a student body of more than 315,000. CCSD operates one of the nation's largest school construction and modernization programs and is anticipated to spend approximately \$5.2 billion through 2010 to build new schools and improve existing schools. CCSD opened 7 new schools and 4 replacement schools for the 2008-2009 school year and will spend an

estimated \$709.6 million from the bond fund during 2008 to 2009.

Higher education institutions are well represented in the Valley. More than 6,000 graduate and professional students are enrolled at the University of Nevada Las Vegas. Since 1969, its school of medicine has been a leader in health care, medical education and research. The College of Southern Nevada (CSN) provides the Las Vegas community with an affordable liberal arts education. Acclaimed programs include automotive, business, accounting/finance, computing, drafting and graphics, law enforcement and public services. CSN regularly has a combined campus enrollment of over 50,000 students.

FINANCIAL INSTITUTIONS



Southern Nevada boasts an impressive array of community banks and financial institutions that combine an in-depth knowledge of the local market with a high degree of personalized service. According to the 2010

Las Vegas Perspective, there are more than 40 banks in Clark County and more than 15 credit unions. Las Vegas Perspective reports that 46,000 people are employed in the finance and insurance sector of the economy.



GAMING, TOURISM & HOSPITALITY

More than 260,000 people in Las Vegas are employed in the gaming, tourism and hospitality industries, which are expected to remain Southern Nevada's top economic drivers for the foreseeable future, and they are also helping to support and grow a number of other industries including construction, technology and health care into major segments of the economy. Within the Leisure and Hospitality category, Accommodation and Food Services is the largest industry sector in Nevada, accounting for 24 percent of Nevada's total employment. Casino-hotels make up about 65 percent of this sector and include businesses primarily engaged in providing lodging and meals. Examples of businesses in this sector are casino-hotels, hotels and motels, restaurants, bars and food service contractors, caterers, mobile canteens and food carts.

GOVERNMENT

The provision of service at the federal, state and local levels makes government the 3rd-largest, service-based employer in Southern Nevada. Among the largest employers in the area are the cities of Henderson, Las Vegas,

North Las Vegas and Clark County (which, alone, employs more than 15,000). In addition to traditional government offices, there are those unique to the state, such as the Gaming Control Board, the federal facilities of the Nevada Test Site and Nellis Air Force Base, which continue to have a major impact on the local economy.

MANUFACTURING & HIGH TECHNOLOGY

The 2009 Las Vegas Perspective lists more than 100 manufacturing companies located in Clark County, representing a wide variety of products, including plastics, concrete, printing and metal work. More than 23,000 people are employed in manufacturing jobs in the Las Vegas area as of the end of April 2009. Located in the city of North Las Vegas, the Cheyenne Technology Corridor (CTC) exemplifies the region's success in attracting high-tech companies. Designated as an integrated, accessible and diversified technology district, the CTC's five-mile stretch boasts office, industrial and retail space. The city of North Las Vegas invested in fiber optic cable, which runs the length of the CTC, is a key element in attracting high-end and high-tech tenants.

Health care

With the rapid population growth experienced in the region, it is no surprise that Southern Nevada has now become a healthcare hub.



Today, there are 15 full-service hospitals in the area, staffed by professional doctors, nurses and other professionals. In addition, there are 14 specialty hospitals that treat a variety of conditions, including rehabilitation, psychiatric, brain injury, stroke and long-term acute care.

To support this leading industry, educational institutions are providing training and continuing education in health care. The University of Nevada School of Medicine offers a four-year curriculum leading to a medical degree or M.D. and offers physician residency and fellowship programs. The school is comprised of 16 clinical departments, including: family medicine, pediatrics, obstetrics and gynecology, internal medicine, surgery, and psychiatry and behavioral sciences and 5 nationally recognized departments in basic science. The school has trained more than 1,500 physicians since its founding in 1969.

Nursing programs are provided at more than 6 institutions in Southern Nevada, including Nevada State University, College of Southern Nevada, the University of Southern Nevada and the University of Nevada Las Vegas. NVDETR reports the median income for a registered nurse in Nevada is \$56,809.

PROFESSIONAL & BUSINESS



SERVICES

Nevada employment levels rose to yet another record in October, surpassing 1.35 million for the first time. The Silver State's employers have added more than 240,000 jobs since the recovery began in late 2010. Our job growth has exceeded the national average in each of the past 63 months. In fact, our most recent calculations show that job gains in Nevada are the strongest in the nation. Still, there remains room for improvement. The jobless rate currently stands at five percent, after peaking at nearly 14 percent during the recession, a remarkable accomplishment.

TRADE, TRANSPORTATION & UTILITIES

With an excellent transportation and communications network, Las Vegas has become a hub for the interaction of Western markets. 80 percent of markets within 500 miles are served by overnight truck delivery at discounted rates, and the area serves as a business link between the Pacific Coast, the Sunbelt Southwest and international markets via McCarran International Airport (6th busiest across the U.S.) Employment figures from NVDETR for the Las Vegas MSA (metropolitan statistical area) reported more than 163,000 workers in the transportation and trade industry in 2009.

HEALTH CARDS

Health Cards are mandatory for all food and beverage handlers, child care employees, adult group care employees, massage therapists, reflexologists, aestheticians, barbers, health club attendants, tattoo operators, permanent make-up artists and body piercing technicians. In order to acquire a health card, you must complete an application form. For a food handler card, applicants will receive a Hepatitis A vaccination. Applicants needing childcare or adult group care cards must also attend a ninety-minute class and movie within 30 days of applying for a health card. A temporary card will be issued once the class is completed. The cost for a health card is \$30 for a three-year issuance. For additional information contact:

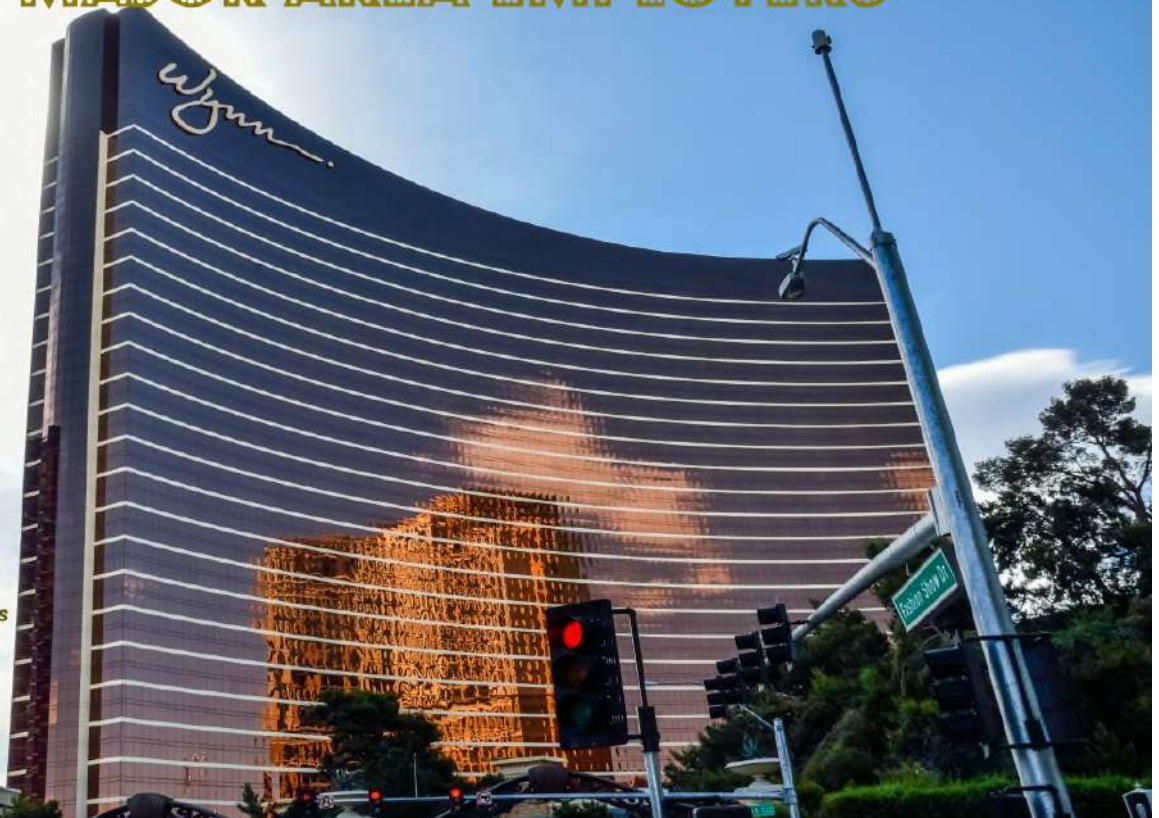

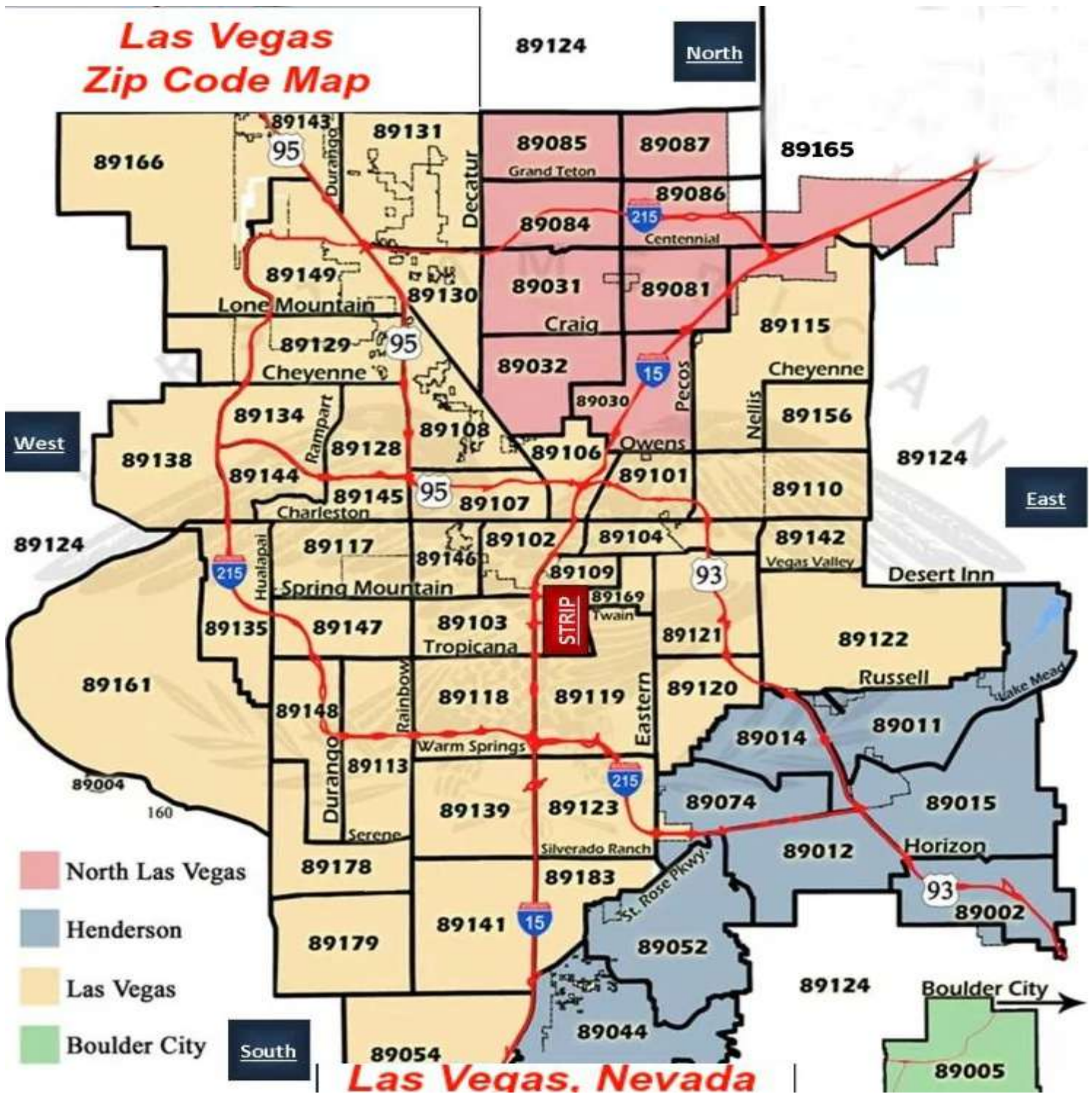
LAS VEGAS ROADWAYS & MAJOR STREETS

Las Vegas streets and roadways have expanded to handle a large amount of traffic due to recent city growth and the development of great communities throughout our area. Though some areas have their high-traffic times, much of the Las Vegas road system handles traffic efficiently and commuters can quickly get around. Here is a list of many of the roadways you will become familiar with when you move to the Las Vegas Valley:

FREEWAYS & HIGHWAYS

Las Vegas is traversed from several major roadways. Basically, there is a large "C" shape with a large "X" cutting through the whole city (*see map on next page*).

- **Beltway 215:** The 215 wraps around the outside of the city forming a "C" shape. It serves much of the valley and for much of it there are no stoplights.
- **1-15 (Interstate 1-15):** The 1-15 comes up from California from the Southwest and moves North East into Utah forming one cross of the "X".
- **1-515/1-95:** The 95, as commonly known in the valley, cuts through the heart of the city from South East to North West creating another cross in the "X".
- **Summerlin Parkway:** The Summerlin Parkway connects the west side of town through Summerlin to the 95, which feeds into the center of town right near the Strip.

It began as a joint venture between the MGM Grand and Bally's Hotel. Why not create a one-mile transportation system between the hotels, encouraging visitors to both? It was an exciting, forward-thinking idea that took off in 1993 and soon included plans to expand to other locations along the Strip. In 1997, state legislature passed that enabled the private monorail company to own, operate, and charge a fare as a public monorail system. As expansion plans developed, the Monorail assembled a professional team that included Bombardier Transportation, Carter-Burgess, Gensler & Associates, Granite Construction Company, Liaise Corporation, Salomon Smith Barney and Transit Systems Management.

The original monorail system was acquired in 2000 by the nonprofit Las Vegas Monorail Company, which was formed to develop, own and operate the Las Vegas Monorail. Today, the Las Vegas Monorail remains the first and only privately owned public transportation system in the U.S. and includes seven stations along its four-mile route. Nearly 32,000 passengers ride the system daily to restaurants, shows, attractions and conventions within the Strip resort corridor.

The RTC began the Citizens Area Transit (CAT) bus system in December 1992. In 2004 the RTC added the first Metropolitan Area Express (MAX) line to its transit system; and in October 2005 The DEUCE double deck bus service began running on the famous Las Vegas Strip. In just 12 short years, rider-ship among the RTC's transit services has grown from 14.9 million riders in 1993 to more than 55 million riders in 2005.

The entire system consists of 51 routes served by 365 vehicles, carrying around 180,000 passengers each weekday in the greater Las Vegas Valley. Service enhancements are completed regularly and new transit guides are issued twice each year. The Regional Transportation Commission of Southern Nevada (RTC) is transforming the image of public transportation and enhancing the quality of life for Southern Nevadans with one of the country's premiere rapid transit projects. A hybrid between bus and rail systems, MAX has many features of rail service with the cost and flexibility of a bus, making it an effective transportation solution.

The MAX project is the first in the United States to operate the Civis vehicle, using the latest technology to provide a high-quality, state-of-the-art, environmentally-friendly transit alternative at a fraction of the cost of a rail service.

Residents can set up their water service by calling (702) 870-4194 between 8am and 5pm on business days. For same-day service, the LVVWD suggests calling before 3:30pm. A \$15 fee applies for all same-day service requests. A minimum \$100 deposit, due at the time of service request, is required for residential properties. A water bill calculator is available on the LVVWD Web site. Residents may also pay bills or put in a stop-service request online.

After purchasing a new home in Las Vegas, the county will be automatically notified and homeowners will receive their first sewer bill in the mail. Single-family residences can expect to pay a base rate of \$221.58 per year or \$55.40 per quarter. Residences with pools are slightly higher than those without. Sewer service bills can be paid online.

Individuals relocating to North Las Vegas must set up and pay their waste and sewer bills through the City of North Las Vegas Utilities Business Service. An e-mail form for answering questions and setting up service is available online. Individuals may also visit one of the two Utilities Business Services Division's offices.

For Las Vegas residents living in unincorporated Clark County, the Clark County Water Reclamation District handles all wastewater and sewer treatment. The annual sewer charge for a residency in unincorporated Clark County is \$194.96. CCWRD bills can be paid online or in person at their office.

New residents can fill out a new service request form online. At the time of sign-up, residents may opt to rent a 96-gallon trashcan from Republic Services or use their own waste receptacles. Republic Services picks up trash twice a week.

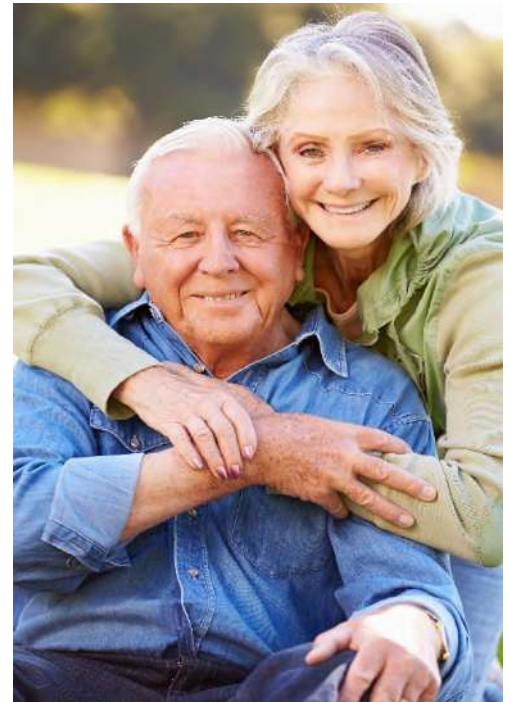

Other Options

Whatever lifestyle you desire, you're sure to find it offered in Las Vegas. There are several other options for seniors who need something a little more than an active, age-restricted community. In addition to some of the best active adult communities in the country, you'll also find:



Continuing Care Retirement Communities

Continuing Care Retirement Communities (CCRCs) allow seniors to "age in place," with flexible accommodations that are designed to meet their health and housing needs as these needs change over time. Seniors who live in this setting can be assured their long-term care needs will be met and will not have to relocate; they can select a service plan to suit their needs, abilities and preferences. Typical assisted living services include recreational, social and educational activities; transportation, emergency help, housekeeping, meals, assistance with daily living and personal assistance.

Assisted Living Facilities

These housing options combine a level of independent living with some assistance for personal care. They provide care to residents who cannot live alone, but do not need 24-hour nursing care. Assisted living communities offer residents the privacy of their own bedroom, often with a small kitchen. Most offer meals in a community dining room, snacks, laundry services, housekeeping and assistance with personal needs such as bathing, dressing or medication supervision. These facilities are not designed for people who need serious medical care, but there are some facilities for people with Alzheimer's, dementia and memory loss.

Residential Care Homes (Personal Care Homes)

These group living facilities, usually single-family homes, are designed to meet the needs of people who cannot live independently, but do not need nursing homes. These homes provide some type of assistance with daily living activities including eating, walking and bathing. Some homes provide skilled nursing, rehabilitative services or specialized care for illnesses such as Alzheimer's.

Skilled Nursing Facilities

A skilled nursing facility is staffed by registered nurses who help provide 24-hour care to those who can no longer care for themselves due to physical, emotional or mental conditions. A licensed physician supervises each patient's care and a nurse or other medical professional is almost always on the premises.

At the state level, the Nevada Department of Health and Human Services develops, coordinates and delivers a comprehensive support service system in order for Nevada's senior citizens to lead independent, meaningful and dignified lives. For more information, contact the Las Vegas office Division of Aging Services at (702) 486-3545 or visit the website at www.dhhs.nv.gov

Programs administered by the state include:

- Advocate for Elders - Advocacy, assistance, information and referral to frail seniors, who are 60 years of age or older, primarily homebound and living in the community and their caregivers.**
- Community Home-Based Initiatives Program (CHIP) - Non-medical services to older persons to help them maintain independence in their own homes as an alternative to nursing home placement.**
- Elder Protective Services (EPS) - for persons 60 years old and older who may experience abuse, neglect, exploitation or isolation.**

- **Grants** - information for current and/or prospective grantees.
- **Homemaker Program** - general housekeeping, limited meal preparation, shopping, laundering and errands, standby assistance with bathing and home management services.
- **Long-Term Care Ombudsman** - address issues and problems faced by residents in long-term care facilities, which includes residential facilities for groups.
- **Senior Ride Program** - discounted taxicab fares to seniors and persons with disabilities residing in Clark County.
- **State Health Insurance Assistance Program (SHIP)** - information, counseling and assistance to Medicare Beneficiaries in Nevada involving a statewide network of volunteers.
- **Tax Assistance/Rent Rebate Program** - this statewide program refunds a portion of the property tax paid by eligible senior citizens on their residence or by property taxes paid by renters through their rent.
- **Waiver for the Elderly in Adult Residential Care (WEARC)** - CHIP services in a group care setting to offer individuals a less expensive alternative of supervised care in a residential setting.

Lake Mead's deep blue waters and 550 miles of shorelines are enjoyed by boaters, water skiers, swimmers, and people hoping to land a trophy fish. The Colorado River offers unforgettable white water rafting. For

hiking, rock climbing and outdoor photography, there is Red Rock Canyon and Mt.

Charleston. Skiers also love Mt. Charleston and the many ski slopes within a short drive

of Las Vegas for their winter fun. Day tours to the Grand Canyon, Valley of Fire and

Death Valley are what memories are made of, and Hoover Dam isn't called the "Eighth

Wonder of the World" for nothing!



BEFORE YOU HEAD OUT...

Las Vegas is situated at the southern tip of Nevada in the Great Basin -- the western region between the Sierra Nevada and Wasatch Mountain ranges. The official elevation of the city is 2,174 feet.

Low humidity, along with ideal spring and fall temperatures, makes Las Vegas a great place practically any time of the year. The average year-round temperature is 80 degrees. Las Vegas is one of the sunniest cities in the United States -- with an average 320 days of sunshine per year and only 4.19 inches of rainfall.

Because of its high desert elevation, the temperature range can be extreme. During the summer, daytime temperatures often reach 100 degrees. It rarely falls below freezing in Las Vegas. When it does, it is usually only in the early morning.

In the winter, the temperature may drop as low as 33 degrees, though the average high is between 50 and 60 degrees.

Lake Mead Recreational Area



With 550 miles of shoreline, Lake Mead is surrounded by various attractions, ranging in distance from 25 miles on the Las Vegas side to 75 miles on the Arizona side.

As the largest man-made lake in the Western hemisphere, Lake Mead extends 110 miles up from Hoover Dam. The recreation area covers some 1.5 million acres and attracts more than 8 million visitors annually for swimming, boating, skiing, fishing and camping. Fishing is open year-round, and anglers harvest large numbers of game fish each year.

Hoover Dam was built in the 1930s at a cost of \$160 million. The Dam, located 40 miles southeast of Las Vegas on U.S. 93, turned the rapids of the Colorado River into the still waters of Lake Mead. Government guides conduct various tours year-round.





The Red Rock Canyon area, located 15 miles west of Las Vegas, provides spectacular views of the valley, unusual rock formations and signs of early Indian life. Red Rock formations and desert scenery attract thousands of bicycle enthusiasts to the 13-mile loop road that winds along the western border of the Las Vegas Valley. Other activities include rock climbing, hiking and auto touring.

Valley of Fire State Park

Dedicated in 1935 as Nevada's first state park, this 56,000-acre wilderness area features colorful, extraordinary rock formations, Native American petroglyphs and year-round campsites.

Spring Mountain Ranch

Historic Spring Mountain Ranch is located within the Red Rock Canyon National Conservation Area, beneath the colorful cliffs of the magnificent Wilson Range. The many springs in these mountains provided water for Paiute Indians and later brought mountain men and early settlers to the area. The 520-acre oasis was developed into a combination working ranch and luxurious retreat.

Floyd Lamb State Park

Originally known as Tule Springs, this park was an early water stop for Native Americans. It later became a privately-owned working ranch, as well as a guest/dude ranch in the 1950's. In addition to the Tule Springs Ranch Historic Area, the park offers tree-shaded groves alongside four small fishing lakes. The park is available for day use only.

Death Valley Park

Covering 3,000 square miles of desert in both California and Nevada, Death Valley is the largest national park in the lower 48 states. Located less than two hours from Las Vegas, Death Valley offers breathtaking landscapes, colorful history and the lowest elevation point in the Western Hemisphere.

Grand Canyon National Park

Located in Northern Arizona, close to the borders of Utah and Nevada, this national park is home to the Grand Canyon, created some 5 million years ago and encompassing 1,904 square miles. The Colorado River, which flows through the canyon, drains water from seven states. Recreational pursuits are vast, including hiking, camping, biking and fishing. Commercial air carriers and tour buses serve visitors from the Las Vegas area.



Humboldt-Toiyabe National Forest

The Las Vegas Ranger District encompasses 316,000 acres of the 3.5 million-acre Toiyabe National Forest. Included are 52 miles of hiking trails, 160 picnic areas and 150 campsites in seven campgrounds and RV parks. Located 40 miles northwest of Las Vegas, the area provides snow skiing at Lee Canyon and horseback riding at Kyle Canyon. Both Lee and Kyle Canyons have an abundance of campgrounds and hiking trails.



Located 45 miles northwest of Las Vegas, Mt. Charleston is situated among 300,000 acres of forestland in the Las Vegas Ranger District. The area includes 52 miles of hiking trails, 160 picnic spots and 150 campsites in seven campgrounds and RV camps. Recreational activities include horseback riding and snow skiing.

BUFFETS



Good food in large quantities has always been a part of the Las Vegas experience. Vegas is famous for its all-you-can-eat buffets, which can be found at nearly every casino. Below you'll find some tips so that your buffet experience is scrumptious, followed by a current listing of buffets in the Las Vegas area.

The most famous buffets in town are at the Rio, Bellagio, Planet Hollywood, Bally's and the Wynn. Above-average buffets typically run about \$30 a person for a weekend dinner — be sure to check ahead if a dress code exists. Lunch is often the best value at many buffets, when they are around half price; breakfasts are cheapest and often have a great spread too. A number of buffets also offer champagne brunches on weekends. Discounts on buffet prices are sometimes available if you sign up for a free membership, and almost all offer a discount for kids. Coupons can also be found in local publications and online.

Lines can be long — arriving early/late can reduce the wait, especially for brunch. You can also try to get a comp to skip the line if you gamble enough or are a valued hotel guest; some of the more upscale buffets also take reservations. Don't forget that tipping your buffet waiter 10-15% is customary! You can leave cash on the table at the end of your meal or tip the cashier at the counter on a credit card.
